GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

The GPA is reported on a 100-point scale, rounded to the nearest hundredth. Only academic courses taken for high school credit are counted in the determination of the GPA. All academic courses are weighted equally except Advanced Placement courses and those designated as Honors courses by the Faculty Academic Committee. Honors courses are weighted three points, and Advanced Placement courses are weighted five points. (The weight is used only to compute the GPA and does not alter the year-end grade achieved by the student.)

In addition to the standard Heathwood GPA, transcripts will indicate a SC UGP GPA (South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy GPA), converted in accordance with guidelines established by the SC Commission on Higher Education.

Heathwood Hall does not report rank to colleges or universities.
